

What to do if ICE approaches you

- DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR.
- DO NOT ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS
- DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING without first speaking to a lawyer.
- If you are outside of your home, ask the agent if you are free to leave and if they say yes, leave calmly.
- GIVE THIS CARD TO THE AGENT. If you are inside of your home, show the card through the window or slide it under the door.

I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution. I do not give you permission to enter my home based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant to enter, signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you slide under the door. I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights. I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.

Introduction:

Congratulations, thanks to all your hard work, your case is now submitted and pending with Immigration! Please remember that you still must check in with your case worker at LSVAP once per month. We know that waiting for a final decision while Immigration reviews your application can be difficult. One thing you can do to make sure that you are up to date with what is going on with your case is check the status of your application online. Here's how!

Step One:

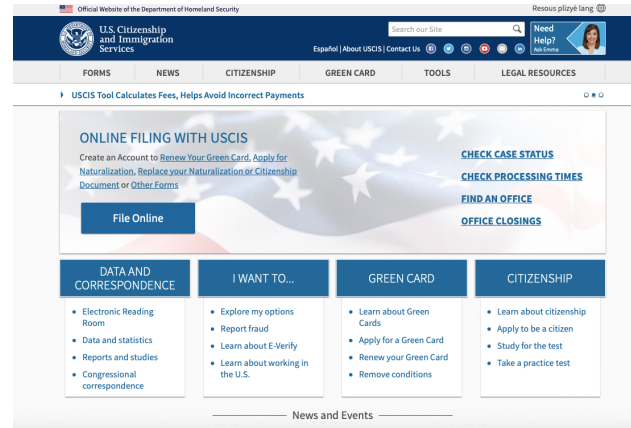
Retrieve your I-797C, Notice of Action Form and locate the *Application/Petition/Request Number and Case Type*.

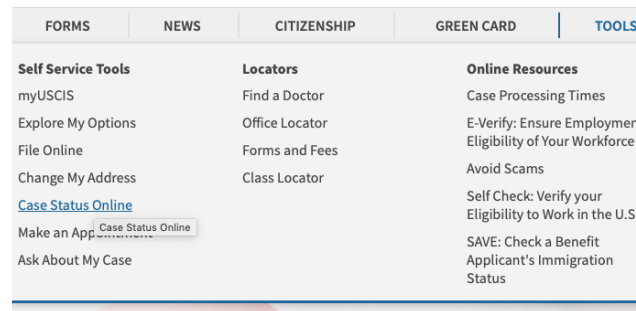
Step Two:

Navigate to uscis.gov



Step Three:

Hover your mouse over "Tools" in the navigation bar at the top of the screen and click on: "Case Status Online"



Step Four:

Enter the "Application/Petition/Request/Number" into the "Receipt Number" box on the screen. Click "Check Status".

Step Five:

From this screen, you can also create an account to receive updates on your case via email or text. Click the "sign up" button in the bottom right corner.
